The most memorable periods are thousand years of Chinese domination, hundred years of French colonization and the civil war for more than two decades. April 30, 1975 marked the unification and freedom in the entire territory, the establishment of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam. The country entered a new phase: reconstruction, integration and development.
- A long time ago, Vietnamese tribes chose to live in fertile plains, along rivers, where there is abundant source of water to grow rice and develop agricultural economy. The Rice Civilization was gradually formed and laid the foundation for the development of Vietnamese society. The agricultural model reflects people's creativity and ingenuity, their respect and harmony with the nature. Although

passing through various stages, the Rice Civilization continues to be closely associated with Vietnamese people's daily life and social life. Currently, Vietnam is still one of world's largest rice exporters and has a significant position in global agriculture.

• Vietnam is a multi-ethnic country with 54 ethnic groups, each with its own attributes expressed through culinary culture, housing, customs, festivals, art and costumes. Over 6,000 folk festivals preserve many layers of culture, moral ideology and philosophy of Vietnamese people. Traditional costumes of ethnic groups are diverse, closely link to labor process, but throughout the country, Ao Dai is



uniformly chosen as the official costume in national ceremonies and international diplomacy. Vietnamese art has a long and rich history, imbued with national identity, influenced by Chinese and French art, expressed through typical architecture, a treasure of valuable folk songs and proverbs, unique and diverse art forms.

- Vietnam has a number of long-standing beliefs, most notably is ancestor worship and animism, which create a connection with the deceased, a close bond within family, and harmony with the nature.
- There are 16 major religions officially recognized in Vietnam, with followers accounting for about 27% of the population; of which Catholic accounts for 7%. The seeds of Gospel were sown in Vietnam by missionaries in 1533. Despite more than 250 years of persecution (1615-1886), the Catholic Church in Vietnam still had a bountiful harvest. Vietnamese Catholics are devout, enthusiastically attending daily Mass and other religious activities.

- Vietnamese people are famous for being hard-working, simple, enduring hardships, studious, open-minded and easy to integrate.
- Vietnamese family traditions are rich in humanity such as respecting the elderly, loving children, and promoting marital loyalty.
